These three luxury mattresses are good enough for royalty—and for some of the finest hotels in the world.

Hypnos (hypnoscanada.com)

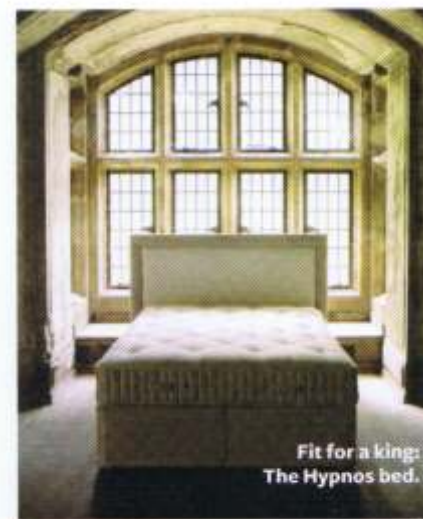
What's inside True hand tufts with all layers stitched together by a three-foot needle. Around 1,000–2,000 honeycombed (nested) mattress coils are individually enveloped in calico cotton. Padding is made from cashmere, lamb's wool, silk and natural latex. Silky, tightly woven damask cover from Belgium. **Warranty** 10 years. **Signature detail** Solid brass air vents. **Good for** The allergy-prone, because of superior dust mite, mould and mildew resistance (and no horsehair). **Price** From \$3,000 (basic queen) to \$10,000 (king-size Eminence). **Sleeps with** British royal family; guests of Pan Pacific Hotels.

Duxiana (duxbed.com)

What's inside Nearly two miles of fine Swedish steel wire for thin and dynamic springs. Natural latex (harvested from rubber trees) for long-lasting and supportive padding, frames of hardy Swedish pine. Soft and durable ticking made from long cotton fibres. **Warranty** 20 years. **Signature detail** A hand crank on some models adjusts lumbar support. **Good for** Couples with different sleep preferences (each side is customizable). **Price** From \$5,000 (basic queen) to \$12,505 (king-size 8888). **Sleeps with** Guests at Hotel Duxiana in Helsingborg, Sweden.

Hästens (hastens.com)

What's inside Solid pine frame from forests in northern Sweden. Each mattress hand-crafted with each virgin steel coil encased in its own pocket for circulation and cooling. Hand-teased horsehair, pure wool, cotton and flax supply breathable and soft padding. All-natural model available. **Warranty** 25 years. **Signature detail** Crisp navy and white gingham ticking. **Good for** Restless sleepers, because it supports your spine and body, encouraging a neutral posture. **Price** From \$4,000 (basic queen) to \$60,000 (king-size Vividus). **Sleeps with** Swedish royal family; guests at Hotel Bel Air, Los Angeles and The Peninsula, Chicago.
